



A brand new musical and a 1950s musical revival in one long weekend

Theatre is a great way to celebrate the full range of human emotion, and these two musicals do that — one that launched on Broadway in 2013 and one with great songs that has been around for 60 years.

Paint Your Wagon opened on Broadway in 1951 and in London in 1953. A film version starring Lee Marvin, Clint Eastwood, and Jean Seberg was produced in 1969. Revivals of the stage musical appeared in 2004 and 2007. The story centres on a miner and his daughter, and follows the lives and loves of the people in a mining camp in Gold Rush-era California. Popular songs from the show include *Wand'rin' Star*, *I Talk to the Trees* and *They Call the Wind Maria*.

Motown by contrast had its Broadway debut in 2013 and ran for nearly two years. It was nominated for four Tony Awards. It is a jukebox musical, based on the story of Berry Gordy's founding and running of the Motown record label, and his personal and professional relationships with Motown artists such as Diana Ross, Smokey Robinson, Marvin Gaye, and Michael Jackson. The musical has an incredible 66 songs packed into 2 hours 40 minutes. It is expected to open in London and reopen on Broadway during 2016.

Itinerary

Thursday, June 9:

Meals: L

We follow the Coquihalla to the lower mainland, then cross the border at Sumas. Our destination is Lynnwood on the north side of Seattle where we settle into the **Embassy Suites Hotel** for three nights. Consistently rated as one of our top lodgings, the hotel had a multi-million dollar renovation in 2015. It features a large plant-filled atrium, a full cooked-to-order breakfast each morning, and a manager's reception with complimentary cocktails and snacks each evening.

Friday, June 10:

Meals: B,L

First we visit the popular **Pike Place Market** to experience some interesting shopping. At 11:30, we board an **Argosy Cruises** vessel for a 45 minute excursion through Seattle's harbour to Blake Island and **Tillicum Village**. In ancient Northwest Coast Native American fashion, you are treated to an award-winning salmon feast prepared over the open fire on cedar planks and served in the traditional cedar longhouse. After lunch, enjoy a stage performance and imagery combining Coast Sa-

lish storytelling and live, traditional dances. Relax on the cruise back with a magnificent view of the Seattle skyline from Elliot Bay. Then join your new Wells Gray friends at the hotel for complimentary beverages. Tonight, we go to the historic Paramount Theatre to see **Motown** starting at 8 pm.

Saturday, June 11:

Meals: B

In the morning, we drive to the **Museum of Flight** which displays over 150 of the world's most remarkable planes including a Concorde, the first 747 and 737 planes, and Air Force One, plus the Red Barn, birthplace of the Boeing Company. Then we go to the ornate 5th Avenue Theatre for the matinee performance of **Paint Your Wagon**. Back at the Embassy Suites, relax over cocktails and snacks.

Sunday, June 12:

Meals: B,L

We stop at the Duty Free Store and cross the border at Sumas. After lunch in Hope, we head for home.

Tour Policies

Payments: A deposit of \$150 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due April 21, 2016.

Discounts: Early bookers receive \$60 discount on first 15 seats and \$30 on next 10 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after April 21.

Cancellation Policy: Up to April 21, your tour payments will be refunded less an administrative charge of \$50 per person. From April 22 to May 9, the cancellation charge is 30% of the tour fare. From May 10 to May 26, the cancellation charge is 60% of the tour fare. After May 26, there is no refund.
