THE PHANTOM OF THE OPERA IN SPOKANE

It opened at Her Majesty's Theatre in London in 1986 with Michael Crawford and Sarah Brightman in the leading roles. The Broadway production at New York's Majestic Theatre opened in 1988 and is still playing 28 years later, making it the longest running Broadway show in history with over 11,335 performances. It is estimated that over 130 million people have seen the show in 27 countries and the box office gross world-wide stands at \$5.6 billion. It has won over 50 awards including the Laurence Olivier and Evening Standard Award for Best Musical, seven Tony Awards, seven Drama Desk Awards and three Outer Critic Circle Awards. We will also enjoy a city tour including Spokane Falls, Riverfront Park, the stunning mansions on "The Hill", majestic Saint John's Cathedral, and the Conservatory in Manito Park. A fun dinner is planned at the unique Steam Plant Grill, built in 1925 to provide steam heat and power for downtown Spokane. It closed in 1986 and was converted in the mid-1990s to a collection of shops and restaurants with a fascinating ambiance.

Alberta has numerous experiences to enjoy, ranging from natural attractions to excellent theatre and fascinating museums. This tour spends a night at Radium Hot Springs, where you can relax in the soothing waters of Canada's biggest hot springs pool. From here we go to Calgary and to the Stage West Dinner Theatre for a superb buffet and the musical comedy **Murder for Two**. Then it's off to Drumheller to the intimate 200-seat Opera House of Rosebud Theatre. Their summer play is **The Spiffire Grill**. We will also attend the **Canadian Badlands Passion Play**, one of only a few large scale dramatic productions in the world that portray the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Before heading home we will visit the impressive Royal Tyrrell Museum, a multi-million dollar tribute to the Dinosaur Age, and enjoy some sights in the Red Deer River Valley near Drumheller, such as the Rosedale Suspension Bridge and the Atlas Coal Mine. Our final theatre production will be **Another Flashdance** at the Jubilations Dinner Theatre.

NEIL DIAMOND IN VANCOUVER

Neil Diamond was born in 1941 in Brooklyn. His career as a singer and songwriter has spanned over five decades starting with the release of *You are My Love at Last* in 1962. As of 2014, he has sold over 125 million records worldwide and is considered to be the third most successful adult contemporary artist on the Billboard chart, behind Barbra Streisand and Elton John. Diamond was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1984 and into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2011. He received the Sammy Cahn Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000 and, in 2011, he was recognized at the Kennedy Center Honors. He has ten #1 hit singles: *Cracklin' Rosie*, *Song Sung Blue*, *Longfellow Serenade*, *Desiree*, *You Don't Bring Me Flowers*, *Love on the Rocks*, *America*, *Yesterday's Songs*, *I'm a Believer*, and *Heartlight*. Diamond released his newest album in October 2016, *Acoustic Christmas*, and it features 12 favourite carols. His other most popular songs such as *Forever In Blue Jeans*, *Sweet Caroline*, *Kentucky Woman*, and *Red Red Wine* have been included on recent albums such as *All-Time Greatest Hits* and *Melody Road*. Diamond's last concert in Vancouver was in 2015. His 50 Year Anniversary World Tour has just been announced for 2017 and this July concert in Vancouver is one of only two performances in Canada.

Leavenworth celebrates the summer of 2017 with its 23rd season of theatre, anchored by its signature production, **The Sound of Music**. Experience the magic of theatre under the stars as you watch the show outdoors at the Ski Hill. The sun falls behind the ridge, the moon rises over the valley, and Maria actually descends the hillside singing the title song. Enjoy your favourite songs from this popular musical — *My Favorite Things*, *Edelweiss*, *Climb Ev'ry Mountain*, and *Do-Re-Mi*. A Bavarian Village classic! **Bye Bye Birdie** is the second featured production which takes place at the Hatchery Park Stage. With lyrics by Lee Adams and music by Charles Strouse, *Bye Bye Birdie* is set in 1958. The story was inspired by the phenomenon of Elvis Presley and his draft notice into the Army in 1957. The rock star character's name, Conrad Birdie, is a play on the name of Conway Twitty who is best remembered today for his long career as a country music star, but in the late 1950s, he was one of Presley's rock 'n' roll rivals. The original 1960 Broadway production won a Tony Award for Best Musical. It generated a London production and several major revivals, a sequel, a 1963 film, and a 1995 television production. The third show is also at Hatchery Park — the beloved musical **Annie**. The original Broadway production opened in 1977 and ran for nearly six years. It spawned numerous productions in many countries, as well as national tours, and won the Tony Award for Best Musical. The musical's songs *Tomorrow*, *You're Never Fully Dressed Without a Smile*, and *It's the Hard Knock Life* are among its most popular musical numbers. Enjoy wonderful professional theatre in a lovely mountain setting with some of the best natural surroundings and unique shops in Washington State.

Come and experience a different kind of river cruising on an intimate ship. The *Canadian Empress* is 33 metres long with a 9-metre beam and a draft of just 1.5 metres. She carries only 66 passengers in 32 cabins. There are three decks. St. Lawrence Deck is the lowest and has most of the cabins and the gift shop. Ottawa Deck has 8 cabins, the Grand Saloon Lounge and Dining Room. The ship docks most nights in a town along the St. Lawrence River, so you can go ashore at your leisure and explore the area. Although the ship enters the USA several times, it does not dock there, so no passport is needed for the whole trip. We will sail the St. Lawrence River from Kingston to Quebec City, and all shore excursions are included. A highlight of our cruise on the *Canadian Empress* is the opportunity to pass through seven locks between Kingston and Montreal, experiencing an overall change in water level of 75 metres! Fly to Toronto and home from Quebec City.


