Itinerary

Thursday, March 8: Meals: L,D

We travel the Coquihalla and take the 5 pm ferry to Swartz Bay. Enjoy the extensive Pacific Dinner Buffet during the crossing. (Note: Most ferries on this route offer the buffet, but an alternative will be arranged if the ship changes.) We stay four nights at **Chateau Victoria** which has an excellent location downtown near the Inner Harbour.

Friday, March 9: Meals: L

A Victoria icon is **Butchart Gardens** where you can admire the splendid display of early spring flowers. Lunch is included at **Abkhazi Garden Teahouse**. This was the home of Prince Nicholas Abkhazi and his wife Peggy who came to Canada from Georgia (Russia) in 1946 and created these gardens with majestic trees and a dramatic location. Tonight, we see **Broadway Lights** at Royal Theatre. Conductor Brian Jackson and the talented young actors at the College of Performing Arts bring the bright lights of Broadway to the Victoria Symphony stage in a high energy extravaganza.

Saturday, March 10: Meals: L

In late morning, we drive over the Malahat to **Chemainus** and enjoy a gourmet buffet lunch at Chemainus Theatre. **Once** won eight 2012 Tony Awards including Best Musical. When a singing Irishman, with little faith left in love and music, meets a beautiful Czech woman in a Dublin bar, they are drawn together by their shared love of music. From flirtation to friendship to an uncommon romance, the unlikely pair connects in search of long-forgotten dreams – a passionate

pursuit that may just tear them apart. Back in Victoria this evening, we go to Langham Court Theatre, an intimate stage with 177 seats, and see **Sense & Sensibility**. You've never seen Jane Austen like this! As the "greatest stage adaptation of this novel in history," this rollicking, ingeniously-staged new adaptation follows the misadventures of the Dashwood sisters – sensible Elinor and hypersensitive Marianne – after their sudden loss of fortune. Bursting with humour, emotion, and bold theatrics, Sense & Sensibility asks: When reputation is everything, how do you follow your heart?

Sunday, March 11: Meals: D

We go to the Royal BC Museum to see a special exhibition, *Wildlife Photographer of the Year*. From the adorable to the elegant, these 100 award-winning images tell astonishing stories of our natural world while pushing the boundaries of technical skill. A film at the Imax Theatre is included. At 2 pm, we see *Pinocchio*, a new adaptation of Carlo Collodi's tale, at the McPherson Playhouse. The spirit of a little boy is trapped inside a piece of wood and born into a strange world. On his quest to become a 'real boy', his journey is fraught with tricksters who mislead Pinocchio on his path. Dinner is included at Vista 18 atop the Chateau Victoria with a fine view of downtown.

Monday, March 12:

Meals: L

We take the 11 am ferry to Tsawwassen with the Pacific Buffet being served for lunch (see March 8 note). We travel home along the Coquihalla.

Tour Policies

Payments: A deposit of \$150 per person is requested at the time of booking and the balance is due January 24, 2018. **Discounts:** Early bookers receive \$70 discount on first 15 seats and \$35 on next 10 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after January 24. BC seniors (65 & over) receive \$12 discount offered by BC Ferries, so you must bring your BC Gold Care Card or the new BC Services Card.

Cancellation Policy: Up to January 24, your tour payments will be refunded less an administrative charge of \$50 per person. From January 25 to February 7, the cancellation charge is 40% of the tour fare. From February 8 to February 21, the cancellation charge is 70% of the tour fare. After February 21, there is no refund.
