Poulsbo Viking Fest honours all the Scandinavian settlers who immigrated to this area by celebrating the Viking heritage. Leavenworth capitalizes on its idyllic alpine setting to create the illusion of a Bavarian hamlet in the middle of Washington State. Winthrop is a testament to the struggles of the wild west era of American history. All four are unique and show us the wonder of the melting pot that is America.

Itinerary

Thursday, May 14:

Meals: L,D

We travel via the Coquihalla Highway, cross the border at Sumas, and arrive in the charming Dutch-themed village of **Lynden**. First we tour the Twin Brook Creamery, then explore the amazing exhibits at Pioneer Museum. We stay overnight at the **Inn at Lynden**, a small boutique hotel on the main street. It was the Lynden Department Store for a century and owner Billy Waples was one of the founding fathers of Lynden. He also owned the Lynden Mill & Light Company which operated a lumber mill, he installed the first electric lights on city streets, he persuaded the first railroad to come through town, and he established the Lynden Fair. His landmark store was destroyed by fire in 2008, but this hotel was built inside the original façade. Lynden has many interesting shops to browse this afternoon. Dinner is at the Dutch Mothers Restaurant.

Friday, May 15:

Meals: B,D

We ride the ferry across Puget Sound from Edmonds to Kingston and make our way to **Poulsbo**, the town that celebrates Norwegian heritage. Poulsbo's annual **Viking Fest** is a celebration of Norway's Constitution Day, the day Norway's parliament adopted its own constitution on May 17, 1814. We check into the Guesthouse Poulsbo for a two night stay. Opening ceremonies take place at 4 pm, and the entertainment at the Kvelstad Pavilion continues into the evening with Sons of Norway dancers and bands. Don't miss the fireworks at dusk. *Velkommen...come join the fun!*

Saturday, May 16:

Meals: B

A full day to enjoy the festival! Visit the carnival to ride the ferris wheel; check out the craft fair; snack on Norwegian food from the vendors; visit the Viking Village; and enjoy the ongoing entertainment at the Kvelstad Pavilion. The annual **Viking Fest Parade** is at 2 pm. Float themes reflect Norwegian heritage, with Scandinavian focus on music, dance, clowns and costumes.

Sunday, May 17:

Meals: B,D

We return to Edmonds on the ferry, then stop at Alderwood Mall for shopping. Afterwards, we drive across scenic Stevens Pass to **Leavenworth**, which celebrates its Bavarian heritage year round. We stay overnight at the lovely Enzian Inn, conveniently located near the town square. There is free time to explore the exquisite shops of this quaint town. Enjoy a traditional Bavarian feast this evening.

Monday, May 18:

Meals: B

The Enzian Inn's bountiful buffet breakfast starts the day. We follow the Columbia River north past two dams and pristine Lake Chelan. Our final themed town is **Winthrop**, which celebrates the Old West. Enter the 1800s as you stroll down the wooden sidewalks of this frontier town. A stop is made at the Duty-Free Store at the border before heading home up the Okanagan Valley.

Tour Policies

Payments: A deposit of \$150 per person is requested at the time of booking and the balance is due March 26, 2020. By paying the deposit, you agree to the Terms & Conditions, Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined.

Discounts: Early bookers receive \$80 discount on first 15 seats and \$40 on next 10 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after March 26.

Cancellation Policy: Up to February 26, 2020, your tour payments will be refunded less an administrative charge of \$50 per person. From February 26 to March 26, the cancellation charge is \$100 per person. From March 27 to April 14, the cancellation charge is 50% of the tour fare. After April 14, there is no refund.

Fare Changes: Changes to currency exchange rates and taxes, and surcharges from tour suppliers can occur at any time and are beyond the control of Wells Gray Tours, therefore Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes up until the time of departure.

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment.
