JASPER PARK LODGE

October 12, 2020 - 5 Days

Includes the Icefields Parkway

Celebrate the majesty of the Canadian Rockies as travellers have been doing for well over a century. Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge has been hosting travellers to the mountains for over a century. This renowned hotel usually charges over \$500 a night for a room and it is booked solid in the summer and fall. The lodge normally offers a seniors' fall getaway at a very attractive price, but is not able to hold this event in 2020 due to Covid restrictions. Wells Gray Tours has secured the same bargain room rate with all meals included, and has arranged all our own private activities during the 2 days and 3 nights stay. This tour offers extraordinary savings and lets you experience this famous lodge at a very attractive price.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Monday, October 12

We travel through Rogers Pass and Kicking Horse Pass and stay overnight at the Lake Louise Inn in the village. A traditional Thanksgiving dinner is offered this evening.

Meals included: Lunch, Dinner Accommodation: Lake Louise Inn

Day 2: Tuesday, October 13

We enjoy the awesome drive along the Icefields Parkway, while admiring the panoramic views of peaks, glaciers, and waterfalls. A highlight is the vast Columbia Icefields which feed water to three oceans. In mid-afternoon, we arrive at splendid Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge for our three-night getaway experience.

Day 3: Wednesday, October 14

This morning, we visit the Jasper Yellowhead Museum which has exhibits about the fur trade, the railway, and early exploration and tourism in Jasper National Park. Some interesting artifacts are Curly Phillips' canoe, the ice axe from Mt. Alberta, and David Thompson's musket balls recovered from Athabasca Pass. An interpretive program may be offered. There are several activities offered during the afternoon:

- 1) A drive to Pyramid and Patricia Lakes.
- 2) A walk from the lodge on a good trail around Lac Beauvert.
- 3) A rafting float trip on the Athabasca River. It's

- a gentle 2-3 hour trip with no white water. \$77 per person. Please book by August 27.
- 4) Enjoy the many facilities at Jasper Park Lodge such as the 18-hole golf course (extra charge), outdoor pool, whirlpool, or health club.

In late afternoon, the lodge historian presents an entertaining talk.

Day 4: Thursday, October 15

A local photographer provides tips about picture taking in the mountains and how to best capture the marvelous panoramas that surround us. This includes an excursion to several viewpoints near Jasper. After lunch, we drive to Maligne Canyon for a short walk with spectacular views of the narrow gorge and waterfalls. Those who want more exercise can take the one-way walk downhill along the canyon rim, and the coach picks you up at the bottom. Instead of Happy Hour at the lodge, join your tour director for a Walk and Wine around the parklike grounds.

Day 5: Friday, October 16

We say farewell to Jasper Park Lodge and travel the Yellowhead Highway past **Mount Robson**, highest in the Canadian Rockies. After lunch in Clearwater, we follow the North Thompson River into Kamloops and continue to the Okanagan.

AUTUMN IN ROCKY MOUNTAIN LUXURY

Celebrate beauty and friendship in the majesty of the Canadian Rockies as travellers have been doing for well over a century. The Grand Trunk Pacific Railway built a tent camp here in 1915 to serve its first-class rail passengers. By 1923, the Canadian National Railway had taken over, and built bungalows and a main lodge building which was said to be the largest single-level log structure in the world. It was destroyed by fire in 1952. Jasper Park Lodge set new high standards for accommodation and hospitality in the wilderness. Many celebrities have stayed, including Bing Crosby, John Travolta, the Kennedys, and Marilyn Monroe. It is a favourite with the Royal Family, and Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip were last here in 2005.

TOUR NOTES

The main building of Jasper Park Lodge has the lobby, dining rooms, lounge, activity rooms, pool, shops, and a few bedrooms available to guests in wheelchairs or with significant mobility challenges. You are staying in rooms located around the extensive parklike grounds in individual cabins, duplexes, or small motel-like buildings. Junior suites may offer a lake view, but Fairmont and deluxe categories do not have a lake view. Most rooms are a 5-10 minute leisurely walk to the main building but, if you prefer not to walk, a very efficient shuttle service operates on request from your room to the main building and back. If you qualify for a room in the main building, we can ask about availability at the time of booking.

Please note that Fairmont rooms, deluxe rooms and junior suites are NOT in the main lodge building.

Activity Level 1: Light activity including short distances to walk and some stairs. See the accommodation note above regarding location of Jasper Park Lodge rooms. Your room is not located in the main building. The coach cannot carry a scooter. If you are not able to participate in Activity Level 1, Wells Gray Tours recommends that you bring a companion to assist you. The tour director and driver have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days of the tour.

This is a Tour 30 departure, meaning capacity of tour is limited to 30 participants, a more intimate travel experience.

TOUR POLICIES

Payments: A deposit of \$150 per person is requested at the time of booking and the balance is due August 27, 2020. By paying the deposit, you agree to the Terms & Conditions, Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined.

Discounts: Early bookers receive \$60 discount on first 15 seats and \$30 on next 10 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after August 27.

Cancellation Policy: Up to July 27, your tour payments will be refunded less an administrative charge of \$50 per person. From July 28 to August 27, the cancellation charge is \$150 per person (your deposit). From August 28 to September 10, the cancellation charge is 50% of tour fare. From September 11 to September 24, the cancellation charge is 80% of tour fare. After September 24, there is no refund.

Fare Changes: Changes to taxes and surcharges from tour suppliers can occur at any time and are beyond the control of Wells Gray Tours, therefore, Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes until departure.

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment.
