## CROATIA BY LAND AND SEA

August 31, 2022 – 15 Days

*Small ship cruising on board MV Admiral*

Spellbinding beaches, dramatic cliffs, ancient walled towns, and a relaxed way of life — Croatia is ranked among the world’s most popular destinations for a reason! We start with 2½ days in historic Dubrovnik, the “Pearl of the Adriatic”. Its picturesque Old Town is considered to be one of the most beautiful cities in Europe with centuries-old forts, buildings on marble streets, and dazzling views of the cliffs and the sea. We then board the *MV Admiral* for a week-long cruise, visiting the seaside coastal towns of Ston, Korčula, Hvar, and Split, and the Adriatic islands of Mljet, Vis, Bisevo, and Brač. The intimate ship has only 20 staterooms and was built in 2015. We finish the tour back on land where we visit Zadar, Pag Island, the waterfalls of Plitvice Lakes National Park, and Croatia’s capital of Zagreb.

## ITINERARY

### Day 1: Wednesday, August 31

Meet the other Wells Gray travellers from the BC Interior and Victoria at YVR. Our flight on Lufthansa departs in late afternoon.

### Day 2: Thursday, September 1

We change planes in Munich and arrive in mid-afternoon in Dubrovnik. **Welcome to Croatia!** We stay two nights at the 4-star Hotel Neptun, located on the waterfront of the Lapad Peninsula just outside Old Town Dubrovnik. Built in 1961 and totally renovated in 2016, it boasts spectacular views of the Adriatic Sea and the Elaphiti Islands. Facilities include three restaurants, a lounge, and indoor and outdoor pools.

### Day 3: Friday, September 2

Founded in the 7<sup>th</sup> century, **Dubrovnik** is noted for its walled Old Town and several monasteries. A local guide conducts a morning walking tour past its most famous attractions: the 14<sup>th</sup>-century Dominican and Franciscan Monasteries, and Rector's Palace. The **Franciscan Monastery** houses the oldest pharmacy in Europe, dating to 1317. We also walk past the Sponza Palace, dating from the 15<sup>th</sup> century and noted for its magnificent 30-metre tall tower. Admission to the **city walls** is included and you can take this exciting walk during leisure time this afternoon.

### Day 4: Saturday, September 3

This morning, we ride the **Srd Mountain cable car** up 400 metres and admire a panoramic view of Dubrovnik and the offshore islands. This afternoon, we take the ferry to **Lokrum Island**, a park just offshore which has the ruins of a monastery and a botanical garden. There are good views of Dubrovnik from the top of the island at Fort Royal Castle, built by the French during Napoleon's occupation of Croatia. Afterwards, we board the **MV Admiral** and settle into our staterooms. Enjoy a meet and greet reception on board. The ship is docked in Dubrovnik overnight.

### Day 5: Sunday, September 4

The morning is leisure time to relax on the ship or explore more sights in Dubrovnik. We cast off at noon and cruise north along the rugged Adriatic coast to Slano, a peaceful fishermen's village. The mighty **Fortress of Ston** and its defensive walls were completed in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. This peninsula is famous for oysters and our tour includes **oyster tasting**. Join the Captain for a welcome dinner with live entertainment.

### Day 6: Monday, September 5

This morning, we cruise a little further north to the **Island of Mljet**. The legend says Greek hero Odysseus spent years on this island when he was captured by the nymph Calypso. Join the cruise manager for a stroll to the remarkable salt lakes in **Mljet National Park** where we take a boat ride to St. Mary Isle and visit an ancient Benedictine monastery, an old abbey, and a church dating to the 12<sup>th</sup> century. Alternatively, you can rent kayaks, bicycles, scooters or convertible cars to roam around the National Park or island on your own, but beware of the nymphs! The ship stays overnight in Pomena on Mljet.

### Day 7: Tuesday, September 6

The Island of **Korčula** is one of the greenest islands in the Adriatic Sea. Like most of the Croatian islands, the Greeks first settled Korčula and gave it the name Korkyra Melaina or 'Black Corfu' for its dark and densely wooded appearance. We have a guided tour of the town, admiring its typical medieval architecture such as towers and clusters of red-roofed houses. Marco Polo, the famous world-traveller, writer, and Venetian merchant was born in Korčula.

### Day 8: Wednesday, September 7

Our next stop is the **island of Vis**, once a strategic naval Yugoslav base and closed to the public for years. Due to this isolation, Vis has a special charm – "the Mediterranean as it once was"

making it really interesting to visit. Vis town, situated on the northern side of the island, has developed near the remains of ancient Issa, the first urban centre in Croatia. Try some exquisite local wines. If interested, visit the remains of the Roman thermal place, City museum, or enjoy a walk with views of the beautiful Villae Rusticae situated along the waterfront. Overnight in the port of Vis.

### **Day 9: Thursday, September 8**

The ship cruises toward the small island of Biševo to visit the **Blue Cave**, a magnificent natural phenomenon. We continue past the Pakleni Islands with a stop for swimming and arrive at **Hvar**. It is the longest and sunniest island in the Adriatic, consistently listed among the world's top 10 islands by Conde Nast. With its colourful fields of lavender and carefully cultivated vineyards, the island is truly appealing. Carpeting the hillsides around its cozy harbour are terracotta-roofed villas, Gothic palaces, and 13<sup>th</sup>-century ramparts rising to an impressive citadel. Our tour includes the Renaissance cathedral with its original tower, and the oldest community theatre in Europe founded in 1612. Hike up the zig-zag path to the fort overlooking the harbour for great views of our ship and nearby islands. In the evening, Hvar offers plenty of entertainment - numerous bars, restaurants, and clubs, many open long into the night. The ship stays overnight in the port.

### **Day 10: Friday, September 9**

This morning, we stop at **Brač island** where swimming is planned at the most famous beach in Dalmatia, Zlatni Rat near Bol. Its shingle promontory shifts from side to side as the wind and waves constantly cause the shape to change. Bol is a typical fishermen's village converted into a popular tourist destination yet retaining its charm. This afternoon, the *Admiral* cruises to **Split**. Founded in the 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, this is now the second largest city in Croatia and has some amazing sights with both Roman and modern architecture. Enjoy a guided walking tour through

the many facades of this beautiful city. Of special interest is the magnificent Diocletian Palace, once inhabited by the Roman Emperor. Our last night on the ship is in Split.

### **Day 11: Saturday, September 10**

We disembark the *Admiral* in Split and our coach is waiting to continue touring Croatia. Our next stop is **Primošten**, built in the 15<sup>th</sup> century on a small island protected by walls and towers. After the Turkish invasion of 1542, the drawbridge was replaced with a causeway. A local guide conducts a walking tour of this unique town. We continue to **Stankovci** and tour a prosciutto production facility with sampling. We stay two nights near Zadar at the Falkensteiner Hotel, located on the private Peninsula Punta Skala and rated 5 stars. Like many Adriatic ports, **Zadar** has historically been dominated by strong neighbours including the Greeks, Romans, Byzantines, and Venetians (who wanted to hold off the Ottoman Turks). In more recent times, the city was invaded by the German army during World War II. As a result, Zadar presents a rich architectural history to the visitor. A walking tour visits St. Donat, an extraordinary church in the pre-Romanesque style with a high, round nave and three semi-circular apses.

### **Day 12: Sunday, September 11**

We spend the day on **Pag Island**, visiting the **Gligora Cheese Factory** with cheese tasting. The famous Pag cheese is made of sage, immortelle, mugwort, cistus, Jerusalem thorn, and fennel, and salted by storms from two sea basins. Later, we go to Lun, at the northern tip of Pag Island, and visit the **Olive Gardens**. Back at our luxurious hotel, you may wish to book a service at the Acquapura Spa, a huge wellness, beauty, and fitness facility.

### **Day 13: Monday, September 12**

Today's highlight is visiting Croatia's magnificent **Plitvice Lakes National Park**. Sixteen terraced lakes surrounded by forest form this UNESCO



World Heritage Site. Numerous waterfalls cascade between the lakes which are separated by natural dams of travertine. We stroll the boardwalks for great views of this natural wonder. Afterwards, we continue to Zagreb for two nights.

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

**Accommodation:** Amadria Park Hotel

### Day 14: Tuesday, September 13

The settlement of **Zagreb** by the Romans dates to the 1<sup>st</sup> century and the name to 1094. It became the new capital of Croatia after the dissolution of Yugoslavia in the early 1990s. A local guide takes us on a city tour through Zagreb's

Old Town, including the Opera House, St. Mark's Church, and the Cathedral. The afternoon is free time. You may wish to explore the fruit and vegetable Dolac Market. A Farewell to Croatia dinner is arranged tonight.

### Day 15: Wednesday, September 14

Our flight on Lufthansa leaves Zagreb, connects in Frankfurt, and arrives in Vancouver in mid-afternoon.

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## WONDERS OF CROATIA

Croatia is a country at the crossroads of Southeast Europe, on the Adriatic Sea. It borders Slovenia to the northwest, Hungary to the northeast, Serbia to the east, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Montenegro to the southeast, and shares a maritime border with Italy. Its capital is Zagreb. Croatia has a population of 4.3 million. Inhabited since the Paleolithic Age, the Croats arrived in the area in the 6<sup>th</sup> century and organized the territory into two duchies by the 9<sup>th</sup> century. Croatia was first internationally recognized as an independent state in 879, then it became a kingdom in 925 which lasted for two centuries. During the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the country was called the State of Slovenes, Croats and Serbs, the Independent State of Croatia, the Federal State of Croatia, and part of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. In 1991, Croatia declared independence and the War of Independence devastated the country for the next four years. Today, Croatia has a very high standard of living, and is a member of the European Union. Tourism is very important, and Croatia is now ranked among the world's top 20 most popular tourist destinations.

Croatia is best seen from land and sea, and this tour has been designed to do just that. We start with 2½ days in historic Dubrovnik. On board the *MV Admiral*, we explore coastal towns like Ston, Korčula, Hvar, and Split. The ship is intimate with only 20 staterooms and was built in 2015. Back on a land tour, we visit Zadar, Pag Island, the waterfalls of Plitvice Lakes National Park, and Croatia's capital of Zagreb.

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## TOUR & CRUISE NOTES

**Please book early.** The operator of the *MV Admiral* has confirmed a block of staterooms for this tour. Our sales will be reviewed on January 31, 2022 and some unsold staterooms may be recalled if the ship is getting full. Small ship cruises in Croatia are very popular and most are sold out long before departure. **It is unlikely that we will be able to secure more staterooms after our unsold rooms are recalled.**

**Documentation:** A valid passport is required with sufficient blank pages and must not expire until three months after return date. A visa is not currently required. Please bring your passport to the Wells Gray office or your travel agent to be scanned, either at booking or at the latest at final payment.

**Currency:** The Croatian Kuna is the standard currency, although the Euro is sometimes accepted in some restaurants and shops. After you arrive, you can exchange Euros at a bank or withdraw cash from an ATM which will give you a better exchange rate than a hotel. On board currency is the Kuna. Purchases can be charged to your ship account and must be paid at the end of the cruise in cash.

**Rooms for singles** are often a different style or smaller size than twin rooms in the hotels (not on the ship). Many hotels limit the number of single rooms allocated to a group. Book early if you prefer a single.

**Triples** are not available on this tour.

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## ON BOARD *MV ADMIRAL*

*MV Admiral* was launched in 2015 and is operated by Katarina Line. With just 20 staterooms and only 3 decks, the experience is intimate and deluxe. The ship is 43 metres long. Public areas include a large salon-restaurant, a lounge at the front with great views and comfortable furniture, an outside covered terrace with sitting area, and a huge partly shaded sun deck with sun beds and jacuzzi. Wi-fi is complimentary. Comfort is essential, so the dress code is relaxed and casual throughout the days and nights. Wine or beer is complimentary at lunch and dinner (2 glasses per person). Two dinners are on the ship and the rest are on your own in ports where we dock overnight. A shore excursion is included at each port and these are usually walking tours with a local guide providing commentary.

There are two categories of staterooms, either Lower Deck or Main Deck. Staterooms are equipped with air conditioning, safe, free wi-fi, satellite TV, hair dryer, and private bathroom with toilet and shower. Most luggage fits under the bed. Main Deck staterooms have a window and Lower Deck staterooms have a porthole. Expect your stateroom to be compact in both categories.



**Activity Level 2:** Light activity on the ship and moderate activity during most shore excursions and pre- and post-cruise tours. Due to the historic nature of some attractions, it may be necessary to climb stairs, walk on uneven surfaces such as cobblestone streets, and walk up to a kilometre at an easy pace. Choose shore excursions based on your ability. Sometimes the coach cannot drive all the way to an attraction. There is no elevator on the ship and there may be stairs between the dining room and your stateroom. There can be longer walks in the airports so you should request a cart or wheelchair in advance or at check-in if this could be an issue for you. The coaches and ship cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. If you are not able to participate in Activity Level 2, Wells Gray Tours recommends that you bring a companion to assist you. The tour director, local guides, and drivers have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. Please consider these mobility issues prior to booking this tour. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days. In extreme situations, you may be required to leave the tour and travel home at your own expense; travel insurance will probably not cover you.

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## TOUR POLICIES

**Payments:** A deposit of \$1,000 per person is requested at the time of booking and the balance is due May 26, 2022. By paying the deposit, you agree to the Terms & Conditions, Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined.

**Discounts:** Early bookers receive \$250 discount on first 10 seats and \$125 on next 6 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after May 26, 2022.

**Cancellation Policy:** Up to March 25, 2022, your tour payments are refunded less a cancellation charge of \$100 per person. From March 26 to May 26, the cancellation charge is \$400 per person. From May 27 to June 24, the cancellation charge is 50% of tour fare. From June 25 to July 26, the cancellation charge is 80% of tour fare. After July 26, there is no refund.

**Changes to tour:** As this tour has been planned over a year in advance, changes to foreign currency exchange rates and taxes, and surcharges from airlines, the cruise ship, and other tour suppliers can occur at any time and are beyond the control of Wells Gray Tours. For these reasons, Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes until departure. Hotels named in the itinerary could change, but substitute accommodation will be of similar or better quality.

**Travel Insurance:** A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. Please contact us for details.

**Home pickups** are available within Greater Vancouver for an additional charge of \$40 per person round trip. Transfer is to and from YVR. Please request no later than at final payment.
