




Chuckwagon Races

Pull on your jeans and boots, don your cowboy hat, and get ready for a yee-haw good time at the annual Calgary Stampede! There is so much to see and do: wander through the barns to view the prize-winning animals, thrill to the rides on the midway, admire some of the greatest western artists in the world, explore the native village, live it up at Nashville North, visit the agricultural shows, and enjoy non-stop live entertainment throughout the day and night. We have included reserved seats to the premier Stampede events: the kick-off parade, the exciting afternoon rodeo, and the spectacular evening of chuckwagon races, stage show, and fireworks. Enjoy a leisurely drive west via Radium Hot Springs and Kootenay National Park.

So come and join us for the 110th Anniversary of "The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth."

ITINERARY

Day 1: Wednesday, July 6

A transfer is provided to Victoria Airport. We fly to Kelowna and stay overnight.

Note: If you live up-Island, we can arrange for your flight from Nanaimo or Comox to Kelowna.

Accommodation: Hampton Inn Kelowna Airport

Day 2: Thursday, July 7

We meet the Interior passengers during pickups through the Okanagan, then we travel east through Rogers Pass. Upon arrival in **Calgary**, we settle into the Glenmore Inn for a three-night stay.

The rooms are spacious with hotel amenities that include an indoor heated pool with water slide, fitness area, wi-fi, restaurant, lounge, and room service. The **White Cowboy Hat ceremony** with a souvenir hat is included during dinner.

Day 3: Friday, July 8

The world-renowned **Calgary Stampede**, "The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth," opens today. This morning, we head downtown for reserved bleacher seating to watch the **kick-off Parade!** The Parade is 4 km long starting with the Showband, followed by a dynamic ribbon of pageantry featuring beautiful floats, bands, riders, celebri-



ties, and cultural entries. Then we head to Stampede Park where there are many exhibits to visit. The afternoon features the exciting **Stampede Rodeo** where the world's best cowboys compete for \$2 million in prize money in events like saddle bronc, bull riding, steer wrestling, calf roping, and barrel racing. Seating is in section 220 of the Grandstand under cover. A transfer is provided back to the hotel following the rodeo, but you can return to the hotel on your own, as there is lots of entertainment in venues around the city.

Day 4: Saturday, July 9

This is another full day at the Calgary Stampede! Several transfers are provided between Stampede Park and the hotel, a 20-minute drive away. A traditional event is the **Pancake Breakfast**, so you can have breakfast at the hotel or at Stampede Park or both. Tonight, we have reserved seats in section 512 for the thrilling **Chuckwagon Races** where four wagons thunder around the track in pursuit of fame and fortune. Next is the **Grandstand Stage Show** with hundreds of entertainers and a dazzling fireworks display lighting up Calgary's night sky.

Accommodation: Glenmore Inn

Day 5: Sunday, July 10

Step back in time during a visit to **Heritage Park**, a lively historical village where you can meet friendly pioneers, ride an authentic steam train, enjoy the antique midway, and immerse yourself in the old west. Also explore Heritage Town Square which includes restaurants, shopping, and the superb **Gasoline Alley Museum** where you can discover how the introduction of the automobile changed our culture. The Cowboy Buffet lunch is included. Leaving Calgary, we head west into the Rockies and drive the scenic highway through Kootenay National Park. This evening, relax in the soothing waters of **Radium Hot Springs**. Sir George Simpson of the Hudson's Bay Company made the first recorded visit in 1841, bathing in a one-person sized pool dug out of the gravel. The present Aquacourt was built in 1951 and is now Canada's largest hot springs pool with a water temperature of 39.4 degrees C.

Accommodation: Prestige Radium Hot Springs

Day 6: Monday, July 11

Near Golden, we visit the **Northern Lights Wolf Centre** where a pack of wolves, all born in captivity, roam a large enclosure. The Centre promotes wolf conservation in a healthy environment. Some of their animals are trained for movies. We travel to Kelowna during the afternoon, and fly home to Victoria (or Nanaimo or Comox).

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch

Activity Level 2: There is lots of walking at Stampede Park as the coach unloading area is on the outer edge. There are stairs to the bleacher seating at the parade. There is elevator or escalator access to the grandstand for rodeo and chuckwagon events, but there may be stairs to reach your seat. Seeing everything mentioned in this itinerary requires participation at Activity Level 2. The coach cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. If Activity Level 2 could be challenging, you are urged to bring a companion to assist you. The tour director and driver have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some tour days.

TOUR POLICIES

Payments: A deposit of \$150 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due May 12, 2022. By paying the deposit, you agree to the Terms & Conditions, Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined.

Discounts: Early bookers receive \$80 discount on first 15 seats and \$40 on next 10 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after May 12, 2022.

Cancellation Policy: Up to April 12, 2022, cancellation charge is \$50 per person. From April 13 to May 12, cancellation charge is \$100 per person. From May 13 to June 6, cancellation charge is 60% of the tour fare. After June 6, there is no refund.

Fare Changes: Changes to taxes and surcharges from tour suppliers can occur at any time and are beyond the control of Wells Gray Tours, therefore, Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes until departure.

Food Allergies: You must notify us no later than at final payment if you have a food allergy.

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. Please contact us for details.

Home pickups may be offered in Greater Victoria, depending on the number of people booked and coach size. Decision is made about 2 weeks before departure and you will be contacted about your pickup point and time.
