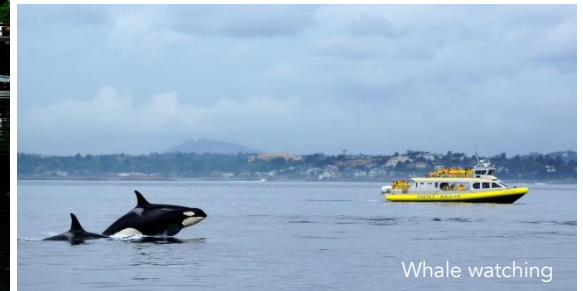

## VANCOUVER ISLAND WITH SMALL SHIPS

September 17, 2022 – 5 Days

*Includes 3 cruises – Gold River to Zeballos,  
Telegraph Cove and Northern Gulf Islands*

Vancouver Island is the 11<sup>th</sup> largest island in Canada, stretching 460 km from the Strait of Juan de Fuca to Queen Charlotte Sound. Named for Captain George Vancouver who explored B.C.'s coast in 1792, the island has great diversity ranging from the capital city of Victoria to remote mountain peaks in Strathcona Park, and from narrow fjords that slice into the west coast to secluded harbours like Telegraph Cove. To explore northern Vancouver Island properly, you have to get out of your car (or coach) and head out on the water. This tour features 3 excursions on small ships – a whale-watching excursion at Telegraph Cove, a private cruise on the *MV Uchuck III* from Zeballos to Gold River through several scenic waterways, and a cruise through the Northern Gulf Islands.

## ITINERARY

### Day 1: Saturday, September 17

After pickups around Greater Victoria, we drive north on the Island Highway with a stop for lunch in Parksville. Our destination is **Telegraph Cove**, a charming village surrounding a narrow harbour. This was the northern terminus of the telegraph line built on Vancouver Island in 1912. A sawmill and commercial fishery supported the village for many years, but 30 years ago it transitioned into tourism. Telegraph Cove Resort owns most of the village and has renovated the old buildings into lodging, restaurant, shops, and a museum. Whale-watching cruises are the big draw with Robson Bight located nearby. Our accommodation is in two buildings, the Lodge and the Dockside. A welcome dinner is at the Whale Café on the waterfront.

### Day 2: Sunday, September 18

Be sure to visit the **Whale Interpretive Centre** on Telegraph Cove's boardwalk. It was founded in 2002 to increase public awareness about the biology of marine mammals and the threats facing their populations. The Centre is home to one of the best collections of marine mammal skeletons in British Columbia. The exhibits focus on orca whales, fin whales, humpback whales, and sea otters. There are also several shops to browse nearby. This afternoon, we board a 70-person semi-covered vessel for a three-hour fully-guided **whale and marine wildlife viewing** excursion. We head out into Johnstone Strait and navigate the Broughton archipelago in search of orcas and humpback whales. Marine mammal experts are on board to bring the animals' stories to life from the comfort of the cruiser.

### Day 3: Monday, September 19

This morning, we drive to **Zeballos**, a tiny community at the end of a fjord on the west coast of Vancouver Island. This waterway was named for Lt. Ciriaco Ceballos, a crew member on board the Malaspina expedition of 1789-1794. A gold rush in the 1930s established a mining camp

spelled "Zeballos" and that name became official when a post office opened in 1946. Zeballos may have had a population of over 5,000 during the peak of the gold rush when \$13 million worth of gold bricks were shipped from here. Forestry replaced mining in the 1950s. Today, Zeballos has shrunk to about 100 residents. About 1 pm, we board the **MV Uchuck III** for a private five-hour cruise from Zeballos to Gold River with splendid coastal scenery. Catherine Gilbert, a local historian and Nootka expert, is on board to provide interpretive talks. Our route follows a maze of narrow waterways such as Zeballos Inlet, Esperanza Narrows, and Tahsis Inlet. Emerging into **Nootka Sound**, the ship sails along the north side of Bligh Island, named for the *Mutiny on the Bounty* captain who was in these waters with Captain Vancouver in 1792. Then we cruise along Muchalat Inlet to the dock near **Gold River**.

### Day 4: Tuesday, September 20

Catherine is with us again during a morning drive through **Strathcona Park**. This was British Columbia's first provincial park, established in 1911, and it protects the rugged peaks of central Vancouver Island. We take a short walk in the forest to see Lady Falls. Our next boat excursion leaves from Campbell River and weaves for five hours among the **Northern Gulf Islands** such as Quadra, Cortes, Read, and Redonda. These waterways are great for whale watching and we keep an eye open for many types of marine life.

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch

### Day 5: Wednesday, September 21

We take a ferry from Crofton to **Salt Spring Island**. World class artisans and crafters abound here, drawn by the laid-back idyllic lifestyle and a vibrant market for their work. The seaside village of Ganges has many craft shops and galleries. A local guide meets us for a drive around Salt Spring Island, finishing at the Fulford Harbour ferry terminal. From there, it is a short ride over to Swartz Bay.

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch



## *MV UCHUCK III*

*MV Uchuck III* derives her name from the First Nations Nootkan word for “healing waters” and has been serving the west coast of Vancouver Island area for nearly 70 years. She was built in 1942 in Oregon as a minesweeper, then was converted to passenger and freight service in Barkley Sound. By 1961, she was operating in Nootka Sound, supplying remote logging camps and fishing villages. More recently, *Uchuck III* was fully renovated with a comfortable wood-finished lounge, coffee shop, bathrooms, and lots of seating on the open-air upper deck. She is 41 metres long and carries 100 passengers on public cruises, but this is a private charter with only Wells Gray customers on board.

## TOUR NOTES

**Nanaimo, Comox, Courtenay & area clients:** You can easily join this tour. We will pick you up on September 17 in your home city and drop you off on September 21. Fares are reduced by \$46 per person since you will miss the visit to Salt Spring Island and lunch on September 21.

 **Activity Level 2:** Moderate activity on some days including short distances to walk and some stairs or gangways getting on and off the three vessels. The ramps to the boat docks may be steep at low tide. A small shuttle is available between the Lodge rooms and the dock where the restaurant, shops, and boat are located, or you can walk (about 10 mins). Telegraph Cove is a compact village with a boardwalk that accesses businesses, and the coach cannot drive there. The coach and boats cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. If Activity Level 2 could be challenging, you are urged to bring a companion to assist you. The tour director and driver have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days of the tour.

## TOUR POLICIES

**Payments:** A deposit of \$200 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due August 3, 2022. By paying the deposit, you agree to the Terms & Conditions, Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined.

**Discounts:** Early bookers receive \$120 discount on first 12 seats and \$60 on next 8 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after August 3, 2022.

**Cancellation Policy:** Up to July 4, 2022, the cancellation charge is \$50 per person. From July 5 to August 3, the cancellation charge is \$150 per person. From August 4 to August 16, the cancellation charge is 60% of the tour fare. After August 16, there is no refund.

**Fare Changes:** Changes to taxes and surcharges from tour suppliers can occur at any time and are beyond the control of Wells Gray Tours, therefore, Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes until departure.

**Travel Insurance:** A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. Please contact us for details.
