DEPARTURE INFORMATION

Your departure point will be discussed at the time of booking.

I BC Interior: We depart on Tuesday, April 7 and fly from Kelowna to Toronto. We fly home from Toronto to Kelowna on Sunday, April 12. Transportation is provided from your pickup location on the day of departure and back when we return.

V Vancouver Island: We depart on Tuesday, April 7 and fly from Victoria, Nanaimo, or Comox to Toronto. We fly home from Toronto on Sunday, April 12.

Departure from Victoria: For passengers in the Greater Victoria Area, transportation is provided from your pickup point on the day of departure and back when we return. Home pickup may be offered in the Greater Victoria Area depending on the number of people booked and coach size. The decision is made about 2 weeks before departure and you will be contacted about your pickup point and time.

Departure from Up-island: Transportation to/from Nanaimo or Comox Airport is not provided. Please note that while we always prioritize convenient connections for our clients, sometimes it is not possible given the airline schedule and availability. You will be contacted regarding your schedule after final payment. Please request departure from Nanaimo or Comox at the time of booking.

L Lower Mainland: We depart on Tuesday, April 7 and fly from Vancouver to Toronto. We fly from Toronto to Vancouver on Sunday, April 12.

Departure from Vancouver: Home pickup in the Greater Vancouver Area can be arranged at the time of booking.

Departure from Langley, Abbotsford, or Chilliwack: No transportation is provided to/from Vancouver Airport.

Activity Level 2

Moderate Activity: As a traveller you like a variety of activities and walking up to 2 km with breaks such as a guided walking tour is very doable for you without assistance.

There will be stairs to climb or descend to get to your ballpark seats. Expect to walk from the hotel to Rogers Centre, the CN Tower, Aquarium, Brewery, and return.

You may bring a cane or walking poles if needed. The coach cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. The tour director and driver have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days of the tour.

ITINERARY

Tuesday, April 7

We fly to Toronto and check in at our hotel, conveniently located a few blocks from **Rogers Centre** and the iconic CN Tower.

Accommodation: Radisson Blu Toronto Downtown

Wednesday, April 8

After a relaxed morning, we visit the **CN Tower**, a defining feature of Toronto's skyline, standing an impressive 553 metres tall. Originally constructed between 1973 and 1975 to improve telecommunications, today it remains a hub of broadcasting and a must-visit attraction. Can you stand on the glass floor? Later, we enjoy a behind-the-scenes tour of the Rogers Centre Ballpark, including a visit to the dugouts while learning about the rich history of the Toronto Blue Jays. Afterwards, we settle in for the excitement as the **Blue Jays take on the Los Angeles Dodgers!** A \$50 gift card is provided that you can use anywhere in the ballpark during any of the three games.

Thursday, April 9

Today is devoted to exploring Niagara Falls. First, we visit **Niagara Takes Flight**, a new (in 2025) virtual immersive flying theatre ride that takes you to the skies for an incredible journey over the falls and along the Niagara River corridor. Lunch is included in the revolving restaurant atop **Skylon Tower** where we admire a fabulous view of the Horseshoe and American Falls. Then, we enjoy a guided sightseeing tour around Niagara Falls before returning to Toronto.

Friday, April 10

This morning, we explore **Ripley's Aquarium**, home to over 20,000 aquatic animals. It features colourful coral reefs, jellyfish, stingrays, and sharks, and a moving underwater tunnel where visitors can walk beneath swimming sea life. The afternoon is free time. Dinner is at Amsterdam Brewhouse, then at 7 pm we are back at Rogers Centre to see the Blue Jays open their series against the **Minnesota Twins**.

Saturday, April 11

The morning is at leisure. This afternoon, we visit **Steam Whistle Brewery** to enjoy a beer, hear the founding story of Canada's largest independent brewery, and learn the history of the John Street Roundhouse, a National Historic Site built for the Canadian Pacific Railway in 1929 and home to Steam Whistle since 2001. Afterwards, we head back to Rogers Centre for the final game of our tour as the Blue Jays battle the Twins again!

With wonderful memories of baseball and Toronto, we bid farewell to the city. Transportation is provided to the airport for our flights home.

TOUR NOTES

The Toronto Blue Jays: The Blue Jays are a Canadian professional baseball team based in Toronto. They compete in the Major League Baseball (MLB) as a member club of the American League (AL) East division. They are the only Canadian team in the MLB. The Toronto Blue Jays have won two World Series Titles (in 1992 and 1993), two AL pennants (1992 and 1993), and have clinched the American League East Division six times. They came very close to winning the World Series in 2025.

The Los Angeles Dodgers: The Dodgers are one of baseball's most iconic franchises, celebrated for their rich history, legendary players, and loyal fan base. Founded in Brooklyn in 1883 before moving west in 1958, the Dodgers have won the World Series eight times — in 1955, 1959, 1963, 1965, 1981, 1988, 2020, and 2025. Playing at historic Dodger Stadium, they are known for power hitting, strong pitching, and electric crowds. When the Dodgers face the Toronto Blue Jays, fans will enjoy a thrilling cross-border clash between two elite Major League teams and a potential rematch of the 2025 World Series.

The Minnesota Twins: The Twins are a storied Major League Baseball franchise known for their enduring presence and passionate fan base. Based in Minneapolis and named after the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and Saint Paul, the team competes in the American League Central Division and plays home games at Target Field. The franchise dates back to 1894 and moved to Minnesota in 1961 after years as the Washington Senators. Minnesota has captured three World Series titles — in 1924 (as the Senators), 1987, and 1991 — and has produced Hall of Fame talent and memorable postseason moments. When the Twins face the Toronto Blue Jays, fans can look forward to an exciting international matchup between two historic American League teams.

Rogers Centre: Home to the Toronto Blue Jays since 1989, Rogers Centre (formerly named "Skydome") is a landmark in the city's skyline and a hub for sports and entertainment. Spanning 12.7 acres, this impressive venue can accommodate up to 40,000 spectators and has hosted everything from world-class concerts to major sporting events. While the structure remains largely unchanged since its opening, ongoing renovations continue to enhance the fan experience. Transforming the stadium from a baseball diamond to a concert venue is no small feat, taking about 40 hours. Rogers Centre holds a special place in Blue Jays history, as the site of their unforgettable 1993 World Series victory over the Philadelphia Phillies.

Flight seating: We are unable to take requests for window or aisle seating on the planes. The airline will not accept them, as group seating is assigned as a block. If this is important to you, we suggest you take the "No Flight" option with a fare reduction of \$515 and book your own flight which allows seat selection.

Flight upgrades: Please enquire about current prices for upgrades on the flights to Toronto and return. Premium economy and business class may be available.

Flight delays or cancellations: In the event flights are delayed or cancelled by airlines due to weather or other reasons, there may be additional costs to you. Wells Gray Tours will not pay for hotel rooms and meals during the delay. Most travel insurance policies cover expenses incurred for flight delays.

TOUR POLICIES

Payments: A deposit of \$400 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due February 3, 2026. By paying the deposit, you agree to the [Terms & Conditions](#), Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined. Payments can be made by online banking or cheque (3% discount on tour fare), or by Visa or Mastercard.

Early Booking Bonus: Receive a \$100 discount on the first 10 seats and \$50 on the next 6 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after February 3, 2026.

Cancellation Policy: Up to January 16, 2026 the cancellation charge is \$100 per person. From January 17 to February 3 the cancellation charge is \$300 per person. From February 4 to March 3, the cancellation charge is 60% of the tour fare. After March 3, there is no refund.

Itinerary and Fare Changes: Our many suppliers may notify us about changes to the itinerary prior to departure and sometimes during the tour. We do our best to substitute a similar service if something cancels, but occasionally the only alternative is to provide a refund for the missed activity. Please note that if we are forced to cancel a tour component due to an issue beyond our control, the current penalties still apply if you choose to cancel the entire tour. Fuel surcharges and changes to taxes or other tour costs can occur at any time, therefore Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes up to departure.

Baseball Game Delays or Cancellations: Baseball games can be delayed, postponed, cancelled, or rescheduled for a variety of reasons that are beyond our control. We know that this would be disappointing for our customers, but the only refund we might obtain for you would be the actual ticket price of the game. The hotel, flights, and other tour services are all prepaid and are non-refundable at short notice.

Food Allergies: You must notify us no later than at final payment if you have a food allergy. An allergy causes medical distress, a preference does not. For some allergies, please consider bringing your own snacks or food items so you are not dependent on what restaurants are able to serve.

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. This tour stays in Canada, but medical costs can vary wildly from one province to another. While your BC Services Card may partly cover you for a medical issue that arises during the tour, you will probably benefit from trip cancellation and trip interruption coverage in case of illness or a mishap before or during the tour. Many other benefits such as luggage insurance are included. Medical questionnaire is not needed. Please contact us for details. If you have your own travel insurance, please read the policy carefully to be sure that you are adequately covered for medical, cancellation, interruption, and luggage.
