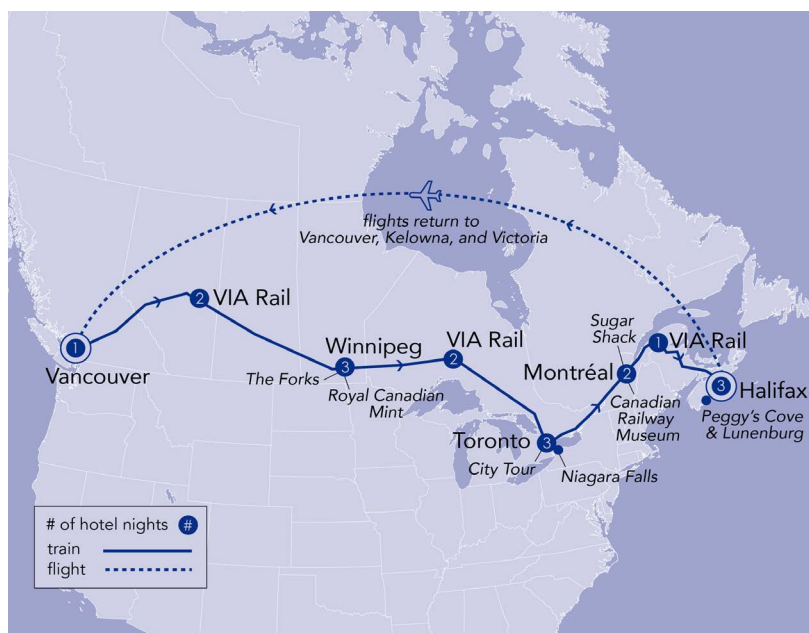

DEPARTURE INFORMATION

Your departure point will be discussed at the time of booking.

- I BC Interior:** We depart on Thursday, April 15 and drive to New Westminster. We board the train the following day in Vancouver. We return on Sunday, May 2, flying from Halifax to Kelowna. Transportation is provided from your pickup location on the day of departure and back when we return.
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- V Vancouver Island:** We depart on Thursday, April 15 and travel to New Westminster. We board the train the following day in Vancouver. We return on Sunday, May 2, flying from Halifax to Victoria, Nanaimo, or Comox.
- Departure from Victoria:** Depending on the number of people booked and coach size, home pickups may be offered in the Greater Victoria Area. The decision is made about 2 weeks before departure and you will be contacted about your pickup point and time.
- Departure from Up-island:** There is an additional cost to join this tour from Nanaimo or Comox. Transportation to and from Nanaimo or Comox Airport is not provided. While we always prioritize convenient connections for our clients, sometimes it is not possible given the airline schedule and availability. You will be contacted regarding your schedule after final payment. Please request departure from Nanaimo or Comox Airport at the time of booking.
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- L Lower Mainland:** We depart on Friday, April 16 and board the train in Vancouver. We return on Sunday, May 2, flying from Halifax to Vancouver.
- Departure from Vancouver:** Home pickup for clients in the Greater Vancouver Area may be arranged at the time of booking.
- Departure from Langley, Abbotsford, or Chilliwack:** Designated pickup points are offered by the BC Interior coach on Thursday, April 15. Flights can be arranged to Abbotsford Airport at the end of the tour on Sunday, May 2. No transportation is provided from the Abbotsford Airport.

ITINERARY

Thursday, April 15

Passengers from Vancouver Island and the BC Interior travel to New Westminster and stay overnight at the Inn at the Quay where every room has a view of the Fraser River. You may enjoy a stroll along the riverfront boardwalk. Dinner is an opportunity to meet your fellow travellers.

Note: While it may seem unnecessary to travel to the Lower Mainland the day before the train leaves, the Coquihalla can have long closures or flights and ferries can be cancelled by weather.

Meals included: Lunch (BC Interior), Dinner

Accommodation: Inn at the Quay (BC Interior & Vancouver Island)

Friday, April 16

We ride to the top of the Vancouver Lookout Tower and ceremonially view the "Pacific Ocean" prior to our journey to the Atlantic Ocean. Vancouver passengers join us at lunch. At 3 pm, we begin our epic adventure on **VIA Rail's The Canadian**, touring Canada's most breathtaking expanses across eight provinces. Relax in the comfort of Sleeper Plus Class with superbly refurbished Art-Deco rail cars from the 1950s. From your armchair or the dome car, admire the views as we travel through the Fraser Valley and the awesome **Fraser Canyon** until dark. Wander over to the Skyline Car and meet other travellers. All meals are included in the elegant dining car with freshly prepared dishes served on china with silverware and linen. We travel through Kamloops about midnight.

Saturday, April 17

During the morning, the train travels through the North Thompson Valley and past soaring **Mount Robson**, highest peak in the Canadian Rockies. After crossing Yellowhead Pass and the Continental Divide, we stop in **Jasper** about 11 am. Savour afternoon tea while following the Athabasca River through the foothills. There is a stop in **Edmonton** during our second sumptuous dinner on board.

Sunday, April 18

At dawn, the train stops in Saskatoon, then we travel across eastern Saskatchewan and Manitoba. The train carries you past vast fields just beginning to green, all under a prairie sky that seems to stretch without end. Our scheduled arrival in Winnipeg is at 10 pm and we stay three nights downtown.

Accommodation: Delta Hotels Winnipeg

Monday, April 19

Winnipeg is one of the most culturally diverse cities in Canada where you can hear some 100 languages. Sleep in this morning after the late evening, then a local guide shows us around Manitoba's capital including St. Boniface and its cathedral, the Legislative Building, Leo Mol Sculpture Garden, and the fine homes along Wellington Crescent. Lunch (on your own) is at **The Forks National Historic Site** where the Assiniboine River meets the Red River. The Forks Market consists of dozens of charming shops with unique wares. During the afternoon, we visit the **Manitoba Museum** to discover the fascinating landscape and history of Manitoba.

Accommodation: Delta Hotels Winnipeg

Tuesday, April 20

We drive to Steinbach to visit an authentic **Mennonite Heritage Village** which has 20 preserved buildings and brings to life the Mennonite way of life from the 16th century to the present. A lunch of traditional Russian cuisine is served in the livery barn. We also make a stop at the Centre of Canada, measured by longitude, just east of Winnipeg. Next is the **Royal Canadian Mint** which produces every coin used in Canada and manufactures coins for about 75 countries. See how massive strips of metal meet 50-ton presses to produce 1,000 coins per second, or about 55 billion coins since 1976.

Wednesday, April 21

The morning is leisure time, then we visit the **Canadian Museum for Human Rights**, an imposing spectacle of architecture. Opened in

2014, it enhances the public's understanding of human rights, promotes respect for others, and encourages reflection and dialogue. Tonight, we attend a cultural presentation by **Winnipeg Folklorama** including dinner and entertainment. Afterwards, we reboard *The Canadian* and the train leaves at 11:30 pm.

Thursday, April 22

When you wake up, the train is travelling through northern Ontario where you can admire the rugged **Canadian Shield**, the immense forests, and many sparkling lakes for most of the day.

Friday, April 23

During the morning, the train travels east of **Georgian Bay** with some glimpses of this vast expanse of water, part of Lake Huron. We are headed into the urban sprawl of Toronto and *The Canadian* arrives at Union Station about 2:30 pm, the end of the second leg of our cross-Canada journey. We walk across the street to the renowned **Fairmont Royal York Hotel** and stay three nights. When the hotel opened in 1929, it was a landmark of downtown Toronto and today seems dwarfed by nearby skyscrapers.

Saturday, April 24

We take a morning tour around **Toronto** with a local guide, passing landmarks such as the CN Tower, Rogers Centre, Eaton Centre, Queen's Park, City Hall, Yonge Street, and the Lake Ontario waterfront. The afternoon is leisure time. Tonight, we go to one of the Mirvish Theatres for a **live stage performance**. The schedule for spring 2027 should be announced in fall 2026.

Accommodation: Fairmont Royal York Hotel

Sunday, April 25

A two-hour train ride on VIA Rail takes us around the west end of Lake Ontario to **Niagara Falls**. It is one of the world's mightiest cataracts, measured by its great width of nearly 1 km, its water volume of about 3 million litres per second, and its height of 50 metres. Our first experience is the cruise to

the bottom of the falls for an awesome view of the Horseshoe and American Falls from the river.

Note: If the cruise is not operating in late April, the replacement is *Niagara Takes Flight*, an immersive flying theatre ride that takes you to the skies for an incredible journey over the falls.

Lunch is at Table Rock Restaurant at the crest of the Horseshoe Falls. An afternoon sightseeing tour of the Niagara area is conducted by a local guide and visits several impressive viewpoints. One of the landmarks of Niagara is the **Skylon Tower** which soars 160 metres above the falls, and dinner is in the revolving restaurant with a panoramic vista. We return to Toronto by coach in the evening.

Monday, April 26

Relax in the exclusive Panorama Lounge at Union Station while waiting for our train departure at 11:30 am. We are whisked from **Toronto to Montréal** at up to 160 kph while enjoying the luxury of Business Class with large seats, a delicious three-course lunch with wine, and many amenities. Arrival is at 5 pm, and we ride the elevator from the train station up to the lobby of the famed **Fairmont Queen Elizabeth Hotel**, a Canadian icon. The hotel is located above Montréal's vast underground city full of interesting shops and restaurants.

Accommodation: Fairmont Queen Elizabeth Hotel

Tuesday, April 27

The city of **Montréal** awaits! Explore this vibrant centre of French Canadian traditions with a locally-guided tour that includes Mount Royal, Île Sainte-Hélène, and downtown landmarks. The tour ends in Old Montréal, where there is free time for lunch. You may want to visit imposing Notre Dame Basilica (admission fee). In the afternoon, we visit the **Biodome** which was built as the cycling stadium for the 1976 Olympics. You can walk through four ecosystems of the Americas: a tropical rainforest, a Laurentian maple forest, the Saint Lawrence marine ecosystem, and the Arctic and Antarctic polar habitat.

Accommodation: Fairmont Queen Elizabeth Hotel

Wednesday, April 28

The **Canadian Railway Museum** is an appropriate stop for our cross-Canada rail journey. It showcases 179 railway vehicles, including historic locomotives, streetcars, passenger cars, and a miniature HO-scale train exhibit. Lunch is a special treat at Sucrerie de la Montagne, often called a **Sugar Shack**. The traditional sugar bush meal is served (pea soup, omelet, maple ham, meat pie, and pancakes with maple syrup), accompanied by musical entertainment, and finishing with maple taffy. At 7 pm, **The Ocean**, the last of our VIA Rail trains, pulls out of Montréal headed to Halifax. When Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia joined in Confederation to form the Dominion of Canada in 1867, a railway to connect Halifax with the St. Lawrence River was promised. During the night, the train follows the south shore of the St. Lawrence and crosses the neck of the Gaspé Peninsula.

Thursday, April 29

In the morning, we travel along Chaleur Bay, then through New Brunswick to Moncton. In the afternoon, the train skirts the **Bay of Fundy** to Truro, and arrives in Halifax about 7 pm. Having crossed our great nation by rail, we celebrate the sight of the **Atlantic Ocean**. Our hotel for three nights has a great location right on the waterfront in Halifax.

Accommodation: Halifax Marriott Harbourfront

Friday, April 30

The day starts with a locally-guided tour of historic **Halifax** including the waterfront, St. Paul's Church, the universities, the colourful Public Gardens, and residential areas. **Halifax Citadel National Historic Site** is a fortress perched on the hill overlooking the city. Nova Scotia's naval heritage comes alive during a visit to the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic, and we celebrate a maritime tradition during the lively and flavourful **Alexander Keith's Brewery Tour**. Tonight, get set for musical comedy, fun, and frivolity at Grafton Street Dinner Theatre.

Meals included: Breakfast, Dinner

Accommodation: Halifax Marriott Harbourfront

Saturday, May 1

We head to **Peggy's Cove**, the most famous of the picturesque fishing villages along the Atlantic seaboard. There is time to stroll the waterfront and take pictures of its iconic lighthouse. We continue along the delightful coastal drive to **Lunenburg**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and a walking tour highlights its heritage buildings.

Meals included: Breakfast

Accommodation: Halifax Marriott Harbourfront

Sunday, May 2

We fly home from Halifax.



ACTIVITY LEVEL 2



Moderate activity: As a traveller you like a variety of activities and walking up to 2 km with breaks such as a guided walking tour is very doable for you without assistance. You must be able to walk 600 metres (sometimes uphill or downhill)

such as to The Forks in Winnipeg or the Niagara Falls cruise vessel. You may have to walk through up to 5 cars on a moving train to access the dining car. If booking a single bedroom, be aware that at night the toilet is under your murphy bed or you can go down the hall into the next car. **Double bedrooms have upper and lower berths, so one person must be able to get into the upper berth using a ladder.** Steps on and off the train may be awkward for those with mobility challenges.

Due to narrow train corridors, this tour is not appropriate for people who require the use of a walker. The coaches cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. You may bring a cane or walking poles if needed. There can be longer walks in airports while flying home and you must handle your own luggage to the check-in area. The tour director and coach drivers have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days of the tour. In extreme situations, you may be required to leave the tour and travel home at your own expense; travel insurance will probably not cover you.

NOTES ABOUT THE TRAINS

VANCOUVER TO TORONTO – You are reserved in Sleeper Plus Class on *The Canadian*. Sleeping accommodation is in private bedrooms, either double with upper and lower berths or single with lower berth only. Amenities include seats by day and beds at night, electrical outlet, toilet, sink, and mirror. Shower facilities are located nearby. There will be opportunities to visit the Park Car with its excellent views and the Bullet Lounge. All meals are included in the elegant dining car which offers exclusive service for first-class travellers. Wander over to one of the two Skyline Dome Cars which has books, games, lectures on local topics, and refreshments.

Prestige Class – Currently, there are no Prestige Class Cabins available, but we will be gathering a waitlist for clients who are interested. Features include a personal concierge, private washroom with shower, flat screen TV with movie selection, gourmet meals, and complimentary beverages. Please indicate your interest at the time of booking.

TORONTO TO NIAGARA FALLS – All seats are in Economy Class for this two-hour journey.

TORONTO TO MONTRÉAL – Enjoy the luxury of Business Class on this 5½ hour fast train with large comfortable seats, Wi-Fi, and a three-course gourmet lunch with wine. Travel at speeds up to 160 kph.

MONTRÉAL TO HALIFAX – You are booked in Sleeper Plus Class on *The Ocean* with breakfast, lunch and dinner included. Sleeping accommodation is in private cabins, either double with upper and lower berths or single with lower berth only. Amenities include toilet, handbasin, and couch(es) that convert into bed(s).

LUGGAGE – While on the trains, your suitcase is stored in the baggage car. Large suitcases are not permitted in private rooms for overnight stays, so bring a smaller carry-on bag with the things you need for the train journeys. Niagara Falls is a day trip, so your luggage stays in your hotel room.

GRATUITIES – The customary gratuities for train room attendants are not included in your tour fare due to the challenges of distribution on board, so please budget \$5 per person per day. Gratuities are included for the dining car train staff, all included meals off the train, local guides, museum docents, boat crew, and coach drivers (outside of BC). Gratuities to the Wells Gray tour director and BC coach driver are not included and are left to your discretion.

SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT THE TRAIN SCHEDULE – When you travel by train in Canada, it is essential that you are flexible and patient about the schedule, especially arrival and departure times. Expect delays, sometimes many hours! The times mentioned in the itinerary are from VIA Rail's published timetable. Wells Gray Tours cannot be held responsible for additional costs due to a late train. If an extra hotel night is needed (such as in Winnipeg if the April 21 train is late), we will make those arrangements for you and the hotel will bill you directly. There is no refund for missed hotel nights or attractions as these are prepaid. Freight trains have priority over passenger trains, so sometimes the train is hours late into Winnipeg or Toronto, but other times it arrives early! The off-train break is in Winnipeg in 2027 as that fits best into the schedule and there are many activities offered during these three days between trains.

TOUR NOTES

Please book early! Travelling by train across Canada is very popular and the first-class service that we use is in high demand. VIA Rail and many hotels have strict policies about our commitment to the number of rooms needed and will cancel rooms from our original reservation if they can sell the rooms to other visitors. If this happens, we have to consider the tour full, even though seats are available on the motorcoach. This tour is limited to 40 travellers and it usually goes full every year. Therefore, waiting too long to book generally means "Sorry, wait until next year."

Flight seating: We are unable to take requests for window or aisle seating on the planes in any class. The airline will not accept them, as group seating is assigned as a block. If this is important to you, we suggest you take the "No Flight" option with a fare reduction of \$425 and book your own flight which allows seat selection. Please see our [Terms & Conditions](#) for more information on taking the "No Flight" option.

Flight upgrades: Please enquire about current prices for upgrades on the flight from Halifax to home cities. Premium economy may be available.

Flight delays or cancellations: In the event flights are delayed or cancelled by airlines due to weather or other reasons, there may be additional costs to you. Wells Gray Tours will not pay for hotel rooms and meals during the delay. Most travel insurance policies cover expenses incurred for weather delays.

Food Allergies: You must notify us no later than at final payment if you have a food allergy. The trains may not be able to satisfy all food allergies. An allergy causes medical distress, a preference does not. For some allergies, please consider bringing your own snacks or food items so you are not dependent on what restaurants are able to serve.

Show cancellation: It rarely happens, but actors occasionally get sick, or some mishap causes the cancellation of a show. This can occur even shortly before the performance begins. We know that this would be disappointing for our customers, but the only refund we would be able to obtain for you would be the actual ticket price of the show. The trains, hotels, motorcoaches, and other tour services are all prepaid and are non-refundable at short notice.

TOUR POLICIES

Payments: A deposit of \$1,000 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due January 5, 2027. By paying the deposit, you agree to the [Terms & Conditions](#), Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined. Payments can be made by online banking or cheque (3% discount on tour fare), or by Visa or Mastercard.

Cancellation Policy: Up to December 4, 2026, the cancellation charge is \$100 per person. From December 5, 2026 to January 5, 2027, the cancellation charge is \$400 per person. From January 6 to February 5, the cancellation charge is 50% of the tour fare. From February 6 to March 5, the cancellation charge is 80% of the tour fare. After March 5, there is no refund.

Itinerary and Fare Changes: Our many suppliers may notify us about changes to the itinerary prior to departure and sometimes during the tour. We do our best to substitute a similar service if something cancels, but occasionally the only alternative is to provide a refund for the missed activity. Please note that if we are forced to cancel a tour component due to an issue beyond our control, the current penalties still apply if you choose to cancel the entire tour. Fuel surcharges and changes to taxes or other tour costs can occur at any time, therefore Wells Gray Tours reserves the right to increase fares due to such changes up to departure. Please read the information in "Special Note about the Train Schedule."

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard until September 8, 2026 and Battleface after that. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. This tour stays in Canada, but medical costs can vary a lot from one province to another. While your BC Services Card may partly cover you for a medical issue that arises during the tour, you will probably benefit from trip cancellation and trip interruption coverage in case of illness or a mishap before or during the tour. Many other benefits such as luggage insurance are included. Medical questionnaire is not needed. Please contact us for details. If you have your own travel insurance, please read the policy carefully to be sure that you are adequately covered for medical, cancellation, interruption, and luggage.
