In Toronto, a local guide introduces you to the city before you set out on your own with a Hop-on Hop-off bus pass. Enjoy a harbour cruise aboard a tall ship, then ascend the CN Tower for lunch in its revolving restaurant and spectacular views of the city. At Niagara Falls, stand before the magnificent Horseshoe Falls and discover the many ways to experience their awesome power. Cruise close to the misty base, venture behind the cascading water through tunnels carved into bedrock, soar across the Niagara Gorge on the Whirlpool Aero Car, and experience the thrilling multimedia show *Niagara Takes Flight*. In the evening, watch the illuminated falls create a dazzling spectacle from your Hilton hotel and during dinner at Skylon Tower. Theatre lovers will also enjoy shows in Toronto, at the Shaw Festival, and at the Stratford Festival, with titles to be announced in fall 2026.

ITINERARY

Thursday, May 13

Your [departure point](#) will be discussed at the time of booking. We fly to Toronto, arriving early evening. Our coach is waiting to take us downtown for a four-night stay at the Marriott Eaton Centre. It has an excellent location on Bay Street next to the shopping mecca of the Eaton Centre with numerous restaurants nearby.

Friday, May 14

A **sightseeing tour of Toronto** with a local guide passes landmarks such as the CN Tower, the stadiums of Rogers Centre and Scotiabank Arena, Queen's Park, City Hall, and the Lake Ontario waterfront. We visit districts like Yorkville and drive along famous streets including Bay, Yonge, and Bloor. A 48-hour **Hop-on Hop-Off bus pass** is provided so you can easily access attractions that you want to see. A get-acquainted dinner is planned. Our first show is at one of the four Mirvish theatres in Toronto, but the May 2027 schedule has not been finalized.

Saturday, May 15

In late morning, we go to the St. Lawrence Market to browse the myriad of shops. Then we board the *Kajama*, a traditional 50-metre-long, three-masted schooner. Enjoy sailing on Toronto's only **Tall Ship** during this 1½ hour cruise around the harbour.

Sunday, May 16

We ride the fast elevators up the **CN Tower**, one of the tallest buildings in the world at 550 metres, and admire a panoramic view of Toronto. Are you brave enough to stand on the glass floor? Lunch is included in the revolving restaurant. After the Mirvish schedule is released, we can inform you whether we are attending a matinee or evening show, title to be decided.

Monday, May 17

On the way to Niagara Falls, we wander through the colourful beauty of Hamilton's Royal Botanical Gardens with the benefit of a local guide. **Niagara Falls** is one of the world's mightiest waterfalls, measured by its great width of over 1,000 metres, its water volume of about 750,000 gallons per second, and its height of 50 metres. For the next three days, we visit many attractions at and near the falls. The first is **Niagara Takes Flight**, an immersive flying theatre ride that takes you to the skies for an incredible journey over the falls and along the Niagara River gorge. Next is **Journey Behind the Falls**. Start with an elevator ride down, then explore tunnels through the bedrock, feeling the thunderous vibration of the Horseshoe Falls before you see them from a portal behind the falls or an observation platform at the base. We settle into the luxurious **Hilton Fallsview Hotel** for a three-night stay. The hotel has a prime location across the street from the Niagara Casino and just over one block from the waterfront Victoria Park. Every room has a view of the falls and, at night, the illuminated falls create a dazzling spectacle. Dinner is included in the revolving restaurant atop **Skylon Tower** where we admire a fabulous view of the Horseshoe and American Falls, a suitable introduction to our Niagara experience.

Tuesday, May 18

This morning, a sightseeing tour of the Niagara area is conducted by a local guide. We ride the historic **Whirlpool Aero Car** over the Niagara Gorge with spectacular views of the swirling Niagara Whirlpool and the Class 6 wild rapids. Next is a more peaceful attraction, the **Butterfly Conservatory**, a tropical garden oasis that features over 2,000 vibrantly coloured butterflies fluttering freely throughout winding pathways adorned with lush vegetation. Lunch is at Table Rock Restaurant overlooking the Horseshoe Falls. During the afternoon, we explore the **Niagara**

Parks Power Station where exhibits explain the long history of electricity production and the inventions of Nikola Tesla. Take a walk through the 700-metre tailrace tunnel where water used to gush back into the river after generating power. The grand finale of this amazing day is a **Niagara Falls cruise** (formerly *Maid of the Mist*) for an awesome view of the Horseshoe and American Falls from the river.

Wednesday, May 19

With the benefit of a local guide, we drive through the vineyards and fruit orchards along the Niagara Parkway, learning about Laura Secord and the War of 1812. **Niagara-on-the-Lake** is a quaint town of historic buildings and interesting shops, and home to the **Shaw Festival**. The Festival was started in 1962 by lawyer and playwright Brian Doherty, who organized eight weekend performances of George Bernard Shaw's *Don Juan in Hell* and *Candida*. Currently, the Festival produces about ten plays each season with over 800 performances. Upon arrival, we take a backstage tour of the Shaw Festival Theatre. After free time for lunch, we attend a performance at the Shaw Festival with the show title to be announced in fall 2026.

Thursday, May 20

We drive to **Stratford**. This small town became the home of the largest classical repertory theatre in North America thanks to the dream of Tom Patterson. In 1952, he conceived the idea of a theatre festival devoted to the works of William Shakespeare. His vision won the support not only of Stratford City Council and an enthusiastic committee of citizens, but also of the legendary British actor and director Tyrone Guthrie, who agreed to become the first Artistic Director. The inaugural performance was on July 13, 1953, when actor Alec Guinness spoke the opening lines of *Richard III*. Nearly 75 years later, the **Stratford Festival** operates four theatres and has a great diversity of productions, not only Shakespeare. We attend a matinee performance. The 2027 productions will be announced in fall 2026 and there may be a choice of shows. Dinner is at the quaint Parlour Inn.

Friday, May 21

We visit the delightful village of **St. Jacobs**. About 4,000 Mennonites maintain their traditions, lifestyle, and religion from the 19th century and still travel in horse-drawn buggies. Afterwards, we drive to Toronto Airport and stay overnight at the Sheraton Gateway Hotel, conveniently located above Terminal 3.

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch

Accommodation: Sheraton Gateway Hotel

Saturday, May 22

We fly home to Kelowna, Victoria, or Vancouver.

ACTIVITY LEVEL 2



Moderate activity: As a traveller you like a variety of activities and walking up to 2 km with breaks such as a guided walking tour is very doable for you without assistance. You can stand for prolonged periods, negotiate a variety of terrain such as moderate hills comfortably, and can climb two flights of stairs without assistance. At airports, you must handle your own luggage and often walk long distances. You may need to handle your own luggage at the hotel if luggage service is not available.

You may bring a cane or walking poles if needed. This tour is not appropriate for people who require the use of a walker. The coaches cannot carry a scooter or motorized wheelchair. The tour director and driver have many responsibilities, so please do not expect them, or your fellow travellers, to provide ongoing assistance. If you are not capable of keeping up with the group or require frequent assistance, the tour director may stop you from participating in some activities or some days of the tour. In extreme situations, you may be required to leave the tour and travel home at your own expense; travel insurance will probably not cover you.

TOUR NOTES

Please book early! Niagara is a very popular tourist destination. The Hilton Hotel has strict policies about our commitment to the number of rooms needed and will cancel rooms from our original reservation if they can sell the rooms to other visitors. The four theatre productions also require early commitments. If our rooms or seats are recalled, we have to consider the tour full, even though seats are available on the motorcoach. Therefore, waiting too long to book usually means "Sorry, wait until another year."

Flight seating: We are unable to take seating requests of any kind in any class. The airline will not accept them, as group seating is assigned as a block. If this is important to you, we suggest you take the "No Flight" option with a fare reduction of \$730 and book your own flight which allows seat selection. Please see our [Terms and Conditions](#) for more information about the "No Flight" option.

Flight upgrades: Please enquire about current prices for upgrades on the flights to and from Toronto. Business class may be available.

Flight delays or cancellations: In the event flights are delayed or cancelled by airlines due to weather or other reasons, there may be additional costs to you. Wells Gray Tours will not pay for hotel rooms and meals during the delay. Most travel insurance policies cover expenses incurred for flight delays.

Food Allergies: You must notify us no later than at final payment if you have a food allergy. An allergy causes medical distress, a preference does not. For some allergies, please consider bringing your own snacks or food items so you are not dependent on what restaurants are able to serve.

TOUR POLICIES

Payments: A deposit of \$400 per person is requested at the time of booking and balance is due February 9, 2027. By paying the deposit, you agree to the [Terms and Conditions, Company Policies](#), Activity Level and Cancellation Policy outlined. Payments can be made by online banking or cheque (3% discount on tour fare), or by Visa or Mastercard.

Early Booking Bonus: Receive a \$300 discount on the first 12 seats and \$150 on the next 8 seats for booking early with deposit. The discount is not offered after February 9, 2027.

Cancellation Policy:

- Up to January 8, 2027, the cancellation charge is \$100 per person.
- From January 9 to February 9, the cancellation charge is \$400 per person (your deposit).
- From February 10 to March 9, the cancellation charge is 60% of the tour fare.
- After March 9, there is no refund.

Travel Insurance: A Comprehensive Insurance policy is available through Wells Gray Tours and coverage is provided by Travel Guard until September 8, 2026 and Battleface after that. Policies purchased at deposit include a waiver of the pre-existing condition clause for medical and cancellation claims, otherwise policies can be purchased no later than at final payment. This tour stays in Canada, but medical costs can vary a lot from one province/territory to another. While your BC Services Card may partly cover you for a medical issue that arises during the tour, you will probably benefit from trip cancellation and trip interruption coverage in case of illness or a mishap before or during the tour. Many other benefits such as luggage insurance are included. Medical questionnaire is not needed. Please contact us for details. If you have your own travel insurance, please read the policy carefully to be sure that you are adequately covered for medical, cancellation, interruption, and luggage. Insurance premiums are not refundable whether or not you make a claim.
